Like so many others, APHS is excited to have the Rotary Corn Fest coming up soon, with a variety of gift-able items at their booth. And work is commencing soon on repairs to the venerable White Horse. In addition, a training program is being developed for APHS volunteers by curator Joan Reid, to enhance the information can offer to visitors to the museum.
