- Mike will be offered "Pottery Talk" at the Avon Free Library on June 12, with information on this clay source and on the "arrowhead" found on the grounds of his Studio Sales Gallery. "Arrowhead", because the object is possibly not an arrowhead, but the tip end of a spear or dart. The item's age has been professionally pegged at 1,600 years or (perhaps, as estimated by Rochester Museum & Science staffer) 5,000 years.
